S.No.	Function	Details
1	Complaint Handling	Receives, investigates, and resolves complaints of ragging.
2	Awareness Programs	Conducts seminars/workshops to educate about anti-ragging regulations.
3	Monitoring Compliance	Ensures adherence to UGC and other regulatory anti-ragging guidelines.
4	Collaboration	Coordinates with police and educational authorities.
5	Victim Support	Offers psychological and emotional support to affected students.
6	Reporting	Maintains records and reports actions taken to stakeholders and authorities.
